









Smetana Hotel is one Prague's well-kept treasures, residing quietly for centuries as an unassuming Baroque Palace steeped in history at the bank of the Vltava River. With a prime position overlooking the iconic Charles Bridge, Smetana Hotel is located in the historical centre of Prague and boasts magnificent views over the famous Prague Castle.

Once a royal palace of the Pachta family since the 17th century, playing host to the likes of Mozart, Casanova and Wagner, Smetana Hotel retains a majestic glamour, with ornate décor, crystal chandeliers, and ceiling frescoes. Right here, Mozart himself composed his Six German Dances for the Count Pachta during one of their famous family matinees.

- Located just across the Charles Bridge on the river Vltava, with the Old Town Square a lazy 10 minute stroll away, and Prague Castle less than 20 minutes, the hotel's location is unparalleled.
- The name 'Smetana' is the name of an internationally renowned Czech composer Bedřich Smetana, the author of the symphonic cycle 'My Homeland', which portrays the history and landscape of the composer's native land.
- Smetana Hotel was host to several international figurers and personalities, such as Giacomo Casanova, Wilhelm Wagner and Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart.
- Mozart was symbolically imprisoned in the palace by the Count, because he had promised on several occasions to compose a few dance pieces for him. He left only with a few sheets of parchment and ink, in a few hours Mozart finally completed his 6 German Dances, K. 509.
- Smetana Hotel is a true discovery for all the art lovers featuring international art pieces in both rooms and public areas.
